



**Dr. Ruth Hurst** is currently an Assistant Professor in the Psychology Department at UNC-Wilmington. Dr. Hurst is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst who received her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology from UNC-Greensboro. Her areas of interest and expertise are in applied behavior analysis, clinical behavior analysis, behavior genetics, and Asperger's disorder. At UNC-W Dr. Hurst is establishing a program of research designed to phenotype the behavior of mice having genotypes associated with human psychopathology (i.e. autism). This research uses behavior analytic preparations to better understand genetic influences on behavior.

For 'Putting the Pieces Together', Dr. Hurst will discuss Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) and Early Intensive Behavior Intervention (EIBI). She will review what seems to be working, and who it helps and why. Dr. Hurst will also share what we don't know about these methods.
